



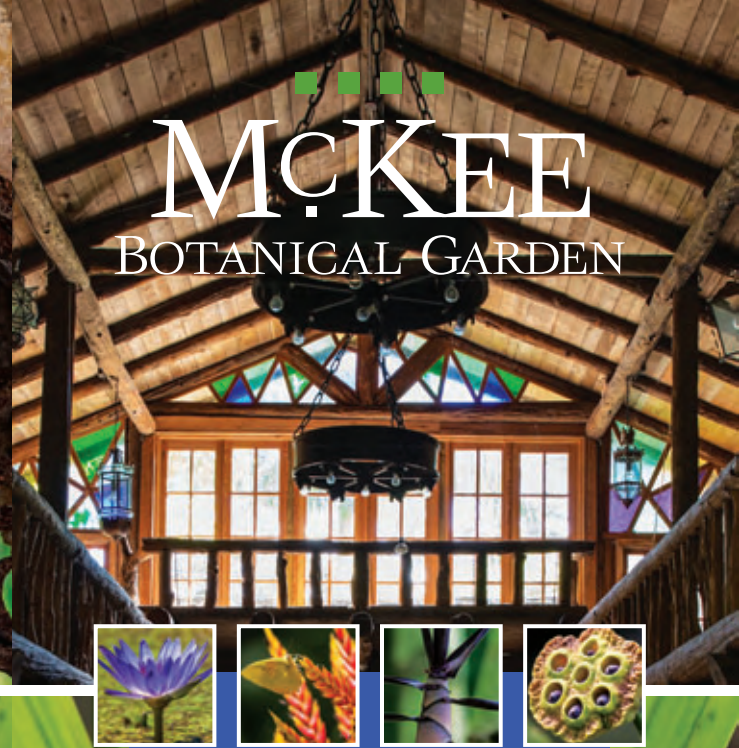

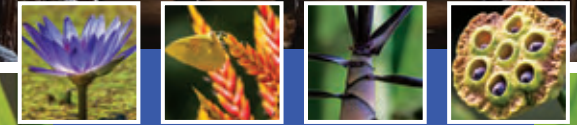

OUR HISTORY

In 1929, developers Waldo Sexton and Arthur McKee looked at 80 acres of natural hammock and saw enormous potential. Three years later, McKee Jungle Gardens opened. This pioneering example of tropical landscape architecture by William Lyman Phillips became one of Florida's earliest and most popular tourist attractions, hosting nearly 100,000 visitors per year.



By the early 1970s, competition from central Florida theme parks caused attendance to decline and in 1976 the Gardens were forced to close. All but 18 acres were developed into condominiums while the remaining acreage lay dormant for twenty years. In 1995, the

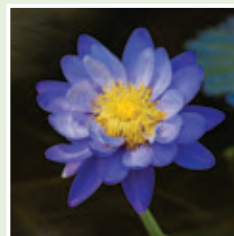


remainder of the Gardens was successfully purchased and a six year restoration process began. McKee Botanical Garden held its formal dedication in November 2001.

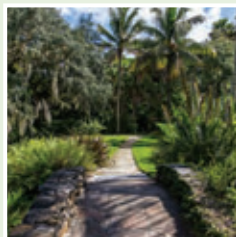
With a renewed focus on native horticulture, the Garden remains true to its jungle heritage, featuring 10,000 native and tropical plants as well as one of the area's largest and most



diverse collections of water lilies. The property houses two unique structures designed and built by founder Waldo Sexton and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.



It is also endorsed by the Garden Conservancy as a project of national significance.
