A TROPICAL FLOCK OF AVIAN AVATARS BY THE MYTH MAKERS: DONNA DODSON & ANDY MOERLEIN

#### **ABOUT THE ARTISTS**

The Myth Makers: Donna Dodson & Andy Moerlein are a two-artist team who make site-specific monumental works of art. The collaboration between Andy Moerlein and Donna Dodson is born from a mutual love of the wild. Moerlein takes inspiration from events in the natural world that leave visual marks, which strike a narrative chord in the artist. Dodson takes inspiration from the mysterious nature of animals that spark her imagination. Storytelling and community are important aspects of their design process. Their projects frequently incorporate workshops, public talks, or onsite building with volunteers. Together, this dynamic duo has compiled more than fifty projects internationally, and they have received multiple national awards and recognitions.





CKee Botanical Garden is pleased to host this innovative exhibit featuring ten monumental and environmentally friendly bird sculptures created from bamboo and other mixed media. Each unique Avian Avatar in the Tropical Flock has been made specifically for McKee. These majestic birds have been strategically placed in McKee's tropical landscape and will be on display through April 28, 2024. The sculptures are designed to attract, captivate, and inspire the imaginations of all who encounter them.

Made from natural materials including bamboo and wood, plus a variety of recycled, repurposed, and reused materials that evoke the feeling of feathers, these site-specific sculptures are interactive and accessible. Their monumental scale and site specificity invite visitors to experience them in a variety of ways—walking by them, resting in them, or walking or running playfully through them. The sculptures engage viewers with their impressive scale, unique fabrication techniques and compelling visual appeal.

The exhibit relates back to the historic gardens at McKee that include a bamboo glade from the 1930s on the Main Jungle Trail. Also along the Bamboo Trail are numerous recently planted varieties of bamboo including Guadua bamboo from South America. This timber grade bamboo was used to build the Bamboo Pavilion at McKee, the first hurricane engineered bamboo structure in the United States.





n Wednesday, November 1, McKee Botanical Garden hosted its Annual Gatekeeper Celebration to recognize and honor its most dedicated and visionary supporters— Gatekeepers of the Garden. Gatekeepers are a distinguished group of individuals who demonstrate leadership

This year's event coincided with the opening of our newest exhibition: A Tropical Flock of Avian Avatars by The Myth Makers Donna Dodson and Andy Moerlein. Guests enjoyed a sip and stroll through the Garden this year that provided an opportunity to admire the ten largerthan-life bird sculptures created from bamboo and other mixed media. ## XAVIER CORTADA COMPLETES ART INSTALLATION AS PART OF MCKEE'S 20TH ANNIVERSARY REVITALIZATION PROJECT

s part of McKee's 20th Anniversary Revitalization project, internationally renowned Miami artist and educator Xavier Cortada recently completed five site-specific, permanent artworks created specifically for McKee. As you stroll the pathways of the Garden, you will discover five colorful columns. Each five-foot tall column is wrapped in a floristic glazed tile "mural," and capped with a sculptural ceramic planter.

This installation comprises a series of colorful ceramic tile murals and sculptures that aim to evoke feelings of love, joy, and reverence by celebrating the local flora that flourishes within the garden.



#### LOVE, JOY AND REVERENCE

One of three sculptures depicting local flora at the entrance of a trail in McKee Botanical Garden, "Love" (in red) exudes warmth, encouraging visitors to embrace the power of love, find solace in the beauty of their surroundings, and reflect on their deep appreciation for nature. "Joy" radiates vibrant yellow hues, inviting visitors to revel in the exuberance that nature bestows. It serves as a reminder to lean into joy and find inspiration amidst the serenity of the garden. "Reverence" (in blue) aims to instill a sense of awe and respect for the interconnectedness of all living things. It prompts reflection on the beauty of nature and inspires a deep reverence for the natural world.

#### STRENGTH AND RESILIENCE

At the end of one of McKee Botanical Garden's trails, one finds two vibrant, ceramic-tile clad sculptures inviting visitors to embrace the transformative power of nature, connect with its inherent resilience, and reflect on the strength we each possess to foster a more sustainable society. "Strength" (in orange) emanates a sense of determination and fortitude. This artwork inspires visitors to tap into their inner strength, find solace in nature's nurturing embrace, and emerge stronger than before. "Resilience" (in green) stands as a testament to the unwavering spirit found in nature and within us, urging visitors to embrace their ability to overcome challenges, adapt, and thrive.

o you remember the giant wooden chair that was nestled in the foliage of the Royal Palm Grove? Do you wonder what happened to it and are you also curious about its history?

The Druid chair was an inspiration of a different sort. I have to reveal an unknown truth, I'm a Druid, dragon fan and I love the magical combination of magic, imagination, and nature. When McKee began the Fairy Festival I thought there should be a nature based mystical component to the event something to encourage and awe children of any age. I realized that handing out old wood walking canes, bows, and arrows would not have the



consequences I intended (ha ha). So instead, I came up with another idea. My inspiration was inspired from watching reruns of *The Carol Burnett Show* (really). Remember the "little girl" character that sat on a huge, oversized rocking chair? Well, I thought, "What if we made a huge wooden throne so children felt like they were sitting on an actual throne, but in the woods, perhaps like a Druid would have?" With the help of volunteers, along with hearts of pine logs collected during the rehabilitation of the Garden, the Druid chair was created. ## PERSPECTIVE

Tam so grateful to have represented McKee Botanical Garden at the 2023 International Waterlily and Water Gardening Society Symposium held this past August in Vancouver, British Columbia. Members gathered this year, as they have for the past three decades, with one common pursuit, to learn more about aquatic gardening.



Speakers included horticulturists, nursery owners, architects, engineers, and enthusiasts. Discussions addressed the environmental limits we all are challenged by no matter where we choose to grow our waterlilies, but being in a northern climate, I was repeatedly reminded of how fortunate I am to have subtropical McKee as my classroom/playground. I discovered the hurdles others face growing the tropical lilies that bloom for our guests year-round. This introduced me to new propagation and storage methods. The stories of success these same gardeners experienced growing hardy waterlilies, a challenge in Florida, have taught me new ways to better care for these cold tolerant plants.

Also discussed was the growing popularity and benefits of natural swim ponds how they are engineered and maintained without chemicals, planted to clean themselves, and how they can work with, not stand apart, from the surrounding landscape. This is exactly what McKee's system has been doing since 2001.

Another topic was how to build a bog garden. Many don't realize that within our integrated garden at McKee, there are seven functioning bogs that filter 800,000 gallons of winding waterways, turning leaf matter into the rich silt that aquatic plants love.

Attendees garnered this education against the beautiful backdrops of the University of British Columbia Botanical Garden, VanDusen Botanical Garden, and Butchart Gardens. I am thankful for the new perspective I gained at this symposium that highlighted how truly unique McKee is and always has been.
